Dear Member,

SEFF has been extremely busy over the last month through integrating new staff within the organisation which will see new services developed and offered for members and those attached to our partner groups.

We now have in place our Health and Wellbeing Casework team - Martina Virtue (Western Region) and Doreen Mullan (Southern Region & Cookstown District) and our N.I/Rol Advocacy team - Ken Funston (Advocacy Services Manager) Peter Murtagh (Greater Belfast and South Down Region) Ann Travers (Mid-Ulster with outreach into Rol cases) and Wendy Stewart (Western Region with outreach into Rol Cases)

In the first week of August we hope to complete the recruitment process in appointing an Advocacy Support worker in London who will service GB-based victims/survivors.

I want to thank the new staff for their patience and cooperation as we work together in building a framework for these two important Peace IV funded services to be delivered for the benefit of victims and survivors.

Appointments are offered on a weekly basis for whatever period support is required, typically appointments will last 50 minutes.. SEFF are able to provide a Counselling service in various areas across the province, please see below for details Helen Murphy (Based in Lisnaskea), Anna Frith (Fermanagh & Clogher Valley), Susanne Roleston (Banbridge) and Ruth Wilson (Cookstown, Moygashel and Richhill).

Counsellor Bio's

Helen Murphy is a qualified, BACP accredited counsellor with 19 years of counselling experience. During this time she has built up extensive professional experience and training which includes her specialist area of trauma, whether as a result of domestic vio-

lence, the 'Troubles' or abuse of any kind. Her experience also includes working with bereavement, stress, depression and anxiety, as well as self-esteem, assertiveness, relationship, work and health related issues.

Helen's approach is Integrative counselling which aims to facilitate wholeness, tailoring the therapy to best suit individual needs. Difficulties usually impact the whole person: thoughts, feelings, behaviour as well as their physical being. Helen's belief in the individuality and worth of each person is supported by this approach.

She offers the opportunity to address difficulties in a safe, non-judgemental, confidential space.

Helen works out of the SEFF office on an appointment basis every Friday.





Susanne Roleston lives in Banbridge and is a Mum of 2 teenage sons. She worked as a nurse for 22 years and then qualified as Counsellor in 2010 with Dip (HE) in Counselling with a Distinction from UU.

She went on to study for a University Advanced Diploma in Cognitive Behavioural Studies and Skills 2013 and completed part 1 EMDR training. Part 2 , she is an accredited member of BACP.

Other training she has attained includes Mental Health First Aid, and ASIST. She is Counter Terrorism Check security cleared and Access NI enhanced disclosure cleared.

Susanne has worked as a Counsellor for SEFF since 2014, working with ex security force members and innocent victims, in addition to this she works in a GP surgery as a counsellor since 2010. She also works with Carecall/Inspire wellbeing since 2011. This involves working with current serving members of PSNI and NI Prison service staff. Also counselling experience with Aftercare clients (ex UDR/RIR personnel) referred for counselling through Carecall/Inspirewellbeing.

Susanne has an interest in supporting current and ex serving personnel, she herself has family members who were military/RUC/PSNI. This has provided me with inside view of the experiences and personal difficulties experienced.

Susanne provides Counselling for SEFF members within the Banbridge area.

Anna Frith's central vision as a counsellor is to help each person develop self-awareness and understanding, resolve obstacles to personal growth, make good use of their own resources and discover hope for the future. Each person is accepted, respected and supported.

She works with diverse age groups, backgrounds and concerns, tailoring her approach to meet the needs of the individual. She has proven counselling experience in a GP surgery, the Aisling Centre in Enniskillen, post-primary schools, in her own business and with CRUSE Bereavement Care.

Anna is married with two children, both in their twenties. Before training as a counsellor, she enjoyed a successful career as a primary and special school teacher. She has strong communication skills and is an excellent, compassionate listener. She is conscientious, reliable, hard-working and self-motivated, with a good sense of humour. She is both professional and caring.

McCann's comments are not

McCann (the new Chairman of Fermanagh and Omagh District Council) where he failed to condemn the Enniskillen Poppy Day massacre and where he lauded PIRA terrorist and serial killer Seamus McElwaine

Kenny Donaldson, Director of Services for Lisnaskea-based South East Fermanagh Founda-

"Stephen McCann's comments represent further evidence that Sinn Fein/PIRA are unprepared to deal openly and generously with the terror and wrong they visited upon their neighbours".

"The Enniskillen Poppy Day massacre (30 year Anniversary this year) was a brutal act of sectarian bloodshed. In this Country and moreover the wider Island there is both a spoken and unspoken value attached to remembering and respecting the dead, therefore on 8th November 1987 PIRA plummeted to even deeper depths of depravity in targeting an event where men, women and children were gathered to respectfully remember the War dead".

"In Tullyhommon on that same day PIRA's intent was also to cause mass murder. Had the bomb detonated then Enniskillen may well have been a footnote with the deaths of dozens of children on Parade within a range of youth organisations - again respectfully honouring the

"Mr McCann's utterances on Seamus McElwaine are political revisionism in its' most stark form. To suggest that it was the contribution of people like Seamus McElwaine who have made it possible for him to now sit as Chairman of Fermamagh and Omagh District Council is worth examining".

"Mr McCann's terrorism idolatry of a man who along with a small team of others was responsible for upwards on 30 murders in the south Fermanagh area alone is beyond contempt. Mr McElwaine's naked sectarianism alongside the policy of his employers to seek to ethnically cleanse the south Fermanagh border areas of the Protestant community is not something Mr McCann should be rejoicing in. Rather those who subscribed to that ideology should be restituting for the grievous wrongs perpetrated against their neighbours".

"Sinn Fein/PIRA need to get real, they have no credibility to speak of 'The Troubles' in County Fermamagh. The statistics don't lie in the case of the County - 91-92% of Troubles related deaths were as a consequence of PIRA terrorism, with a handful of cases involving loyalist terrorism (principally externals to the County) and a small number of cases involving individual members of the security forces who were for the most part convicted (and rightly so) of the crimes they committed. Mr McCann and his SF/PIRA colleagues need to start dealing with facts and cease insulting those whose lives they ravaged," concluded Mr Donaldson.

<u>Lisnaskea-based SEFF commence new Health and Wellbeing service</u> <u>for victims and survivors of 'The Troubles'</u>

Kenny Donaldson, Director of Services at SEFF stated: "SEFF are delighted to have secured in excess of £250,000 of Peace IV funding via The Victims and Survivors Service which will allow us to employ two outreach caseworkers. These individuals will seek to advance and deliver upon the health and wellbeing needs of our members and those of our partner groups across the Western and Southern Health Trust Regions as well as Cookstown District".

"Martina Virtue will be employed as Caseworker for the Western Region (based in SEFF offices, Lisnaskea) and Doreen Mullan will be based in Mid-Ulster servicing the Southern Region and Cookstown District".

"The core purpose of the caseworkers will be to advocate fort and link victims/survivors in with existing health and wellbeing provision across the NHS but also to other support provision including support schemes available via The Victims and Survivors Service which covers areas such as; chronic pain management, disability aids, resilience initiatives etc".

"Health and Wellbeing is the single most important issue for all of us as human beings, but for those who have sustained acute trauma need is even more significant and stark. We have confidence that the new investment made in our organisation will see further progress made around these issues," concluded Mr Donaldson.

ERGS trio and County Down to attend US Conference via SEFF

This Summer local teens, Rebecca Beacom (from Maguiresbridge) Zara Ferguson (from Derrygonnelly) and Alex Kernaghan (from Ballinamallard) will represent South East Fermanagh Foundation at a Global Peacebuilding Conference organised via the Tuesday's Children organisation and its' Project Common Bond Programme. Ellie Heenan from Rathfriland will make up SEFF's quartet of young people attending the Conference.

Those representing SEFF will be part of an International grouping of young people whose families' lives have been directly affected by Terrorism. The Conference will be held at Colby College in Waterville, Maine over the period; July 22nd - July 30th 2017.

The Tuesday's Children organisation was founded to provide support and services for the children of 9/11 and others affected by Global terrorism organised the event through its' Project Common Bond Programme.

Rebecca's Grandfather Albert Beacom was murdered by the IRA on 17th November 1981. Albert was 44-years-old, married with 5 children, a farmer and a part-time member of the UDR holding the rank of Corporal and was from Boyhill,

Maguiresbridge. CPL. Beacom had just returned to his home after leaving his 2 young sons at a Boys Brigade meeting in Brookborough. He left his farm with his 2 boys about a half hour earlier and when her returned, he got out of his car and walked across his farmyard to switch on a pump. Two gunmen ambushed him and shot him 5 times. His wife (Essie) ran out and found her husband dying. He was taken to the Erne Hospital where he was pronounced dead on arrival.

Zara's Uncle Alan Ferguson was murdered on 25th June 1978 aged just 23 years. Alan was single at the time of his death, and was a part-time member of the UDR holding the rank of Private, having joined the Regiment on 4th September 1973. Alan was murdered by IRA terrorists in an attack near Scribbagh post office, Garrison. Other families within the area were systematically targeted and displaced from the area in a campaign of ethnic cleansing.

Alex's Grandfather Herbie Kernaghan who was a part-time member of the Ulster Defence Regiment who was murdered by the IRA on 15th October 1979 when making his morning delivery of fruit and vegetables to a Primary School in Rosslea. Herbie was a devoted family man, married to Sylvia (deceased February 2014) and at the time of his murder they had three children, Deborah (aged 10), Gary (aged 8) and Gordon (aged 6). His fourth child, a son was born on October 29 1979, just two weeks after his murder; he was called Herbert after his father. Herbie joined the UDR upon its formation in 1970.

Ellie's Grandfather William Heenan (aged 51 years) was murdered on 3rd May 1985 by PIRA at his own home in a rural Townland located outside Rathfriland when he was on his way to feed livestock. William was a Protestant civilian. Samuel (Ellie's father) was the only child and at the time lived alone with his father having previously lost both his mother and grandmother in tragic circumstances.

Kenny Donaldson, Director of Services for South East Fermanagh Foundation commented: "SEFF are honoured to be sending four young women to this year's PCB Conference taking place in Waterville, Maine."



"SEFF encourages families and individuals connected with our organisation to build networks with others who come from similar backgrounds and experiences (irrespective of where they are located in the World) Together we are stronger".

"Our participants have made a short Film in advance of attending this year's Conference which they will be bringing with them, in-so-doing educating others from across the World as to the Truth of what happened in Northern Ireland and particularly the experiences of borderland Protestants in County Fermanagh who were murdered via a brutal PIRA campaign of ethnic cleansing".

"The Conference will also examine how genuine and sustainable Peace can be built within and between our peoples of the World; we trust that our SEFF reps come back equipped with a set of skills and learning which will equip them to be leaders within the community in the times that lie ahead".

We plan to have the Quilt completed and to hold a formal dedication of the Memorial Quilt at SEFF's Annual Memorial & Thanksgiving Service which will be held on Sunday 1st October 2017 at 3pm in Fivemiletown Methodist Church.
