I want to also take this opportunity on all your behalves to thank our Advocacy service team, led by Ken Funston for their substantive efforts in ensuring that as many of you as possible were facilitated in engagement with the NIO Legacy Consultation process. SEFF has submitted a strong, fair and realistic response (compete with our own alternative proposals) and we await the outcome of the NIO's response to what they have received over the duration of the Consultation period.

Finally I make reference to Joan Clements who is leaving VSS and moving on to a new role in Fermanagh via The Ely Centre. We are sad to lose her and thank her most sincerely for her efforts and support of SEFF down the years

A Covenant with Seriously Injured Innocent Victims/Survivors of Terrorism

SEFF's Advocacy Support Service (AfIV - Advocacy for Innocent Victims) in conjunction with partner groups is committed to advocating on behalf of those who bare the physical scars of terrorism and criminal violence.

This constituency of victims/survivors have been marginalised and overlooked by Government. There have been minimal advancements made

around their needs and rights to reparations, access to justice and broader welfare related issues.

We have become deeply concerned at the politicised arguments which have prevailed to date and which have prevented innocents from being supported as is the duty of this State.

We submit that the Northern Ireland Office Legacy structures offered an opportunity for some redress to be made but sadly the current proposals are a continuation of what has gone before - the Injured are not viewed a priority.

The UK Government's rationale that Pensions for the seriously injured and a Mental Trauma service are devolved matters is not a sustainable rationale when set against a backdrop of limited prospect of a timely return to devolved Government.

Moreover the overarching improvement in reconciliation and good relations within the community can't be achieved by a dismissive approach to innocent victims and survivors and their legitimate issues.

Airbrushing the terrorist campaign, OTR letters, Royal Prerogatives of Mercy, and a relentless cultural war are all counterproductive and fuel sectarianism. Government must recognise the harm that has been done and rebuild trust with the innocent victims/survivors of terrorism.

(The Covenant as set out overleaf has been developed by SEFF's Advocacy support service in conjunction with partner groups across the victim/survivor sector and follows advice from individual seriously injured victims/survivors)

We call for delivery on the following issues which MUST be legislated for:

- 1 (a) The current definition of victim (N.I Order 2006) must be reviewed and replaced to take account of the issue of innocence. The current definition is at the core of flawed victims' policy.
- (b) We call for a UK-wide definition of victim/survivor of terrorism which would include innocent victims/survivors of terrorism in the Northern Ireland context alongside recent victims/survivors of Islamic-inspired terrorism, Al Quaeda/Daish etc.
- 2. (a) A pension for the seriously injured which allows for innocents injured through no fault of their own to receive this reparation package. (This must apply across the entirety of the United Kingdom as well as Republic of Ireland)
- (b) An appeals process should exist which would consider any case where an individual who has been proven of, or is suspected of criminal activity, would have their circumstances tested against their willingness to show contrition for their previous activities as well as providing information for those who they wronged through their unjust actions.
- 3. A mental trauma service must be introduced which responds to the needs of those who suffer acute mental trauma as a result of their experiences over the years of the terrorist campaign.
- 4. An urgent review of the operations of The PIP benefit (Personal Independence Payment) concerning the difficulties experienced by victims/survivors. Those seriously injured should not have to undergo an assessment process where they are forced to relive Troubles related events.
- 5. The seriously injured must have access to justice, truth and accountability pathways previously denied them. Any potential new investigative process introduced must incorporate the legitimate rights of the injured to be fully involved.

SEFF representatives met with Defence Minister Gavin Williamson MP

SEFF representatives met with Defence Minister Gavin Williamson MP on Friday night last held in The Killyhevlin Hotel c/o Arlene Foster MLA.

Kenny Donaldson, SEFF's Director of Services stated: "We welcomed the opportunity of engaging directly with the Secretary of Defence Gavin Williamson MP on Friday night last. We found the Minister to be genuinely interested to speak with us around a range of issues including; the call for reinstatement of the War Widows Pension for a grouping of widows who remarried but who fall outside previously introduced legislation".

"The Minister took the time to speak with one such affected War Widow, it is clear that Defence have signed off on the proposal but that further work is needed to bring others within the cabinet over the line on the issue. Belatedly the Government must do the right thing and bring some comfort to those who have been so grievously wronged, it must act now before further widows pass away. To not do so is in breach of the very principle and ethos of the Military Covenant".

"We had a useful exchange concerning the debate around issues connected with a statute of limitation and we also raised the need for the UK Government to at times be 'less British,' (in terms of its' acceptance) to be prepared to take its' gloves off and challenge the Republic of Ireland State on its' failings over the years of the terrorist campaign, including holding that State accountable in terms of its' Article 2 compliance in respect of Troubles related murders and deaths within its' jurisdiction".

"We left the Minister with the message that as UK citizens impacted by terrorism that our members expect the UK Government to advocate on behalf of their needs just as the Republic of Ireland State is selectively prepared to do so in particular cases," concluded Mr Donaldson.

SEFF's Welfare & Benefits Service Update

We are aware that a vast number of SEFF members who are in receipt of DLA (Disability Living Allowance) are still awaiting the transition to PIP (Personal Independence Payment).

Tina Grimsley (SEFF's Welfare Officer) along with Norman Kirkpatrick (SEFF's Appeals Officer) are available to meet with people and provide guidance around the various steps of the process and to ensure you have the information you need going forward. Please contact us before you start the process as this can have an adverse effect on your claim.

Are you currently in receipt of any of the following:-

JSA Income Based, ESA Income Based, Income Support, Working Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, Housing Benefit (Rental)

Universal Credit has been rolled out in Fermanagh and this will affect you. It will see a number of people lose their benefits or have their benefits capped.

It has to be realised that Universal Credit works differently from the benefits it replaces. Before making your claim you need to know:

Universal Credit will be paid twice a month, although you may request a monthly payment. You will be expected to make your claim online with your own personal email account.

You will receive a single payment for your household if your Universal Credit includes an amount for rent, it will be paid directly to your landlord - however, subject to certain conditions, you will be able to opt out of direct payments and arrange to pay your landlord yourself. The application has to be completed in one step it can't be saved to finish at a later time.

If you are told to change over to Universal Credit please contact SEFF's Welfare service on 028 677 23884 for assistance and make an appointment or if it just advice you wish feel free to speak to either Tina Grimsley (SEFF's Welfare Officer) or Norman Kirkpatrick (SEFF's Welfare Appeals Officer) in the near future we will also be confirming a new member to the

Bereavement Support Sessions

SEFF's Bereavement Support sessions are recommencing on Thursday 27th September 2018 at 12.30pm - beginning with hot food.

The sessions will be facilitated by Rodney Sharpe (who provides counselling within our partner organisation, MUVE in Cookstown) and will take a different Coffee & Chat format to the last set of sessions. They will be very informal and will function as

more of a 'drop in' service for people who have had loved ones pass away. It will give people an opportunity to come together with others who have been through similar experiences and allow them to

find some comfort in sharing these experiences. **Do not suffer in silence!**

SEFF's West Tyrone Gateway Service Launches

On Wednesday 12th September 2018 SEFF launched a new outreach service in West Tyrone for the benefit of innocent victims/survivors of terrorism. The service is aptly titled; SEFF's West Tyrone Gateway Service. SEFF was established in 1998 and last month celebrated its' 20th year in existence (formed on the day of The Omagh Bomb) will take on offices in Grange Court, Newtownstewart which was the formerly the base of West Tyrone Voice - that group has now dissolved.

In a statement SEFF's Director of Services Kenny Donaldson explains the reason why SEFF has embarked on an outreach



service within the area. Mr Donaldson stated: "Down the years SEFF has enjoyed a close relationship with individual victims/survivors and families based in the Castlederg, Newtownstewart, Strabane, Londonderry/Derry and Claudy areas, such individuals share SEFF's ethos that in the context of Northern Ireland there was never justification for the use of criminal violence in the furtherance of or defence of a political objective".

"SEFF believes passionately in the principle of equality of access for all innocent victims./ survivors of terrorism and in this regard we are committed to ensuring that services are provided as are required. We have a team of staff and service providers who will be based in the Grange Court office and will offer services transcending; health and well-being (counselling and complementary therapies) welfare advice including Appeals and Tribunal representation, Advocacy support for those pursuing justice, truth and accountability, a weekly telephone fellowship service, social support projects including respite, classes and seminars".

Mr Donaldson added: "We were very encouraged by the attendance at last night's launch event held in The Newtownstewart 2000 Centre (well over 100 people in attendance) and we encourage any innocent victim/survivor of terrorism who is not currently linked to or receiving support via The Victims and Survivors Service or another support group to feel able to engage with our services. SEFF has a remit to work with civilians but also the ex security force constituency and their families," concluded Mr Donaldson.







FACT SEPTEMBER 2018 UPDATE
