Dear Member,

Since our last Newsletter much has happened.

There have been significant developments in terms of our outreach services in West Tyrone and South Down respectively.

We also held our 20th Anniversary SEFF Dinner and our Annual Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving in Ballygawley Presbyterian Church, where a fourth Memorial Quilt (this time European themed) was dedicated.

In more recent times a delegation of 40 SEFF representatives based across Northern Ireland, Republic of Ireland and Great Britain went across to Brussels where we launched our "Uniting Innocent Victims" Project in partnership with Spanish victim's group Covite.

The deadline has also come and now gone for the NIO-led Legacy Consultation. SEFF submitted a robust response and we supported well over 1,000 people to engage with the process. I would like to thank the Advocacy Team (led by Ken Funston) for their commitment and hard graft over the Summer period.

I also have some sad news to share with the Membership, we are losing Matthew Gault (SEFF's I.T and Monitoring Development officer) who is going back to University to complete a PhD.

Matthew has been with SEFF for circa 3 years now and will be missed by colleagues and members alike.

You will note within this Newsletter details of our upcoming Community Hallowe'en event and you will also see that unfortunately we are not able to lay on Fireworks this year. This is as a consequence of the School buildings within the former Lisnaskea High School site no longer being available for use because of Insurance, Health and Safety and other legal related issues.

We are instead offering a Hallowe'en family event within the Archdale Hall (and adjacent Market year) Lisnaskea. We appeal with the Membership and the wider community to still come along and support this initiative which we believe will still be enjoyed by youngsters and parents/grandparents alike.

Uniting Innocent Victims / Uniendo Victims Inocentes Project Launches in Brussels

Kenny Donaldson, Director of Services for Lisnaskea-based South East Fermanagh Foundation (SEFF) stated: "The Project launched in the European Parliament on Tuesday - Uniting Innocent Victims / Uniendo Victims Inocentes sent a message across Europe that innocent victims of terrorism will increasingly use their voice to challenge terrorists and their self serving ideologies".

"SEFF and Covite are committed to cementing further our existing relationship so that we might best serve the interests of our respective members. Working together in unity we are undoubtedly stronger than we are when working separately. There are policy issues which innocent victims/survivors can and should address collectively, neither language, ethnicity nor culture need be an insurmountable barrier".

"In recent years there has been a decreased focus placed on the events which unfolded in Northern Ireland and in Spain, focus has turned to the World threat posed by I.S inspired terrorism and extremism".

"However we submit that it is a mistake to divorce the activities and campaigns of terrorism. Throughout the years terrorism has worked together to develop its' strategies - both violently and also politically. The genesis of so much terrorism in our world is founded in the tactics employed by the Provisional IRA, it is the genesis for so much additional bloodshed in our World".

"We are grateful to the good offices of Jim Nicholson MEP, Diane Dodds MEP, Maria Jimenez-Becceril-Barrio and Maite Pagazarundua MEP for standing with innocent victims/survivors of terrorism making it possible for the Project to be presented at the EU Parliament. Many MEP's and Policymakers joined with us for the seminar including Mairead McGuinness (Vice President of The European Parliament)".

"It is written into SEFF's Operational Plan that we will continue to engage with and seek to influence The European Parliament, its' members and officials on victim/survivor and justice issues, BRexit will not bring an end to this essential work," concluded Mr Donaldson.

Meanwhile Covite President Consuelo Ordonez remarked: "Perhaps for COVITE one of the most important contributions our SEFF friends made was this past May, when SEFF's Services Director, Kenny Donaldson, and Advocacy Support Manager, Ken Funston, travelled to San Sebastian in order to support us in a very complicated moment for the victims of ETA's terrorism: the dissolution of ETA".

"The announced end of ETA was a very painful moment for the victims of terrorism. That end was not the end we wanted, neither society nor the victims and, above all, it was not what we deserved. It was an end orchestrated by the propaganda of the terrorist band and calculated to the millimetre. The Government wanted to impose an official story that defended that democracy has defeated ETA, that the rule of law has defeated ETA, that we had to be happy because the terrorism of ETA is over. But, if the Rule of Law had really defeated ETA, they would have given us the picture of the defeat at the hands of the State Security Forces. As they do with any criminal organisation".

"Undoubtedly, if something unites COVITE and SEFF it is the frontal opposition of both associations to terrorism and criminal violence for political purposes. Although the circumstances experienced in Northern Ireland and in the Basque Country and Navarra, with the IRA and with ETA, respectively, are different, both COVITE and SEFF are aware that we are political victims, because our relatives were killed by a totalitarian and excluding political project".

"Both ETA and the IRA are not just an acronym, they are not just a band of criminals: they are political projects. And, now, the terrorists of both organizations are trying to impose those projects from our institutions. The ideologues and political heirs of both terrorist organizations are in our institutions thanks to ETA and the IRA. For this reason, it is very important not only to delegitimize terrorist violence, but also to delegitimize the political project that prompted both terrorist organisations to kill".

Cristina Cuesta, daughter of Enrique Cuesta Jiménez, delegate of the Telefónica company in the province of Guipúzcoa, assassinated March 26, 1982 by the Autonomous Anticapitalist Commandos (CAA), which were constituted in 1976 from a split of an even more radical wing of ETA.

Cristina was one of the pioneers in starting activist movements against terrorism to mobilize the Basque society, which used to remain silent and impassive while ETA extorted, kidnapped and murdered. She founded the Association for Peace, the first organized response of civil society against terrorist violence. Cristina became the target of ETA for her activism and had to take an escort, a situation that forced her to move to Madrid.

In 1998 she was one of the three founders of the Colectivo de Víctimas de Terrorismo (COVITE). Cristina Cuesta chaired the organization for several years. Enrique Cuesta's eldest daughter also participated in the Forum of Ermua and was a spokesperson for ¡Basta ya!, platform that received in 2000 the Sakharov Prize of the European Parliament for freedom of conscience. She is currently the director of the Miguel Ángel Blanco Foundation, which also works to preserve the Memory of the victims of terrorism.

Details of the SEFF member(s) who gave testimony:

Tina Smith (widow of Cpl Stephen Smith) supported by her daughters Louise Freeman and Jade Smith.

Cpl Smith was murdered by Provisional IRA terrorists in Hanover, West Germany on 2nd July 1989 when PIRA terrorists attached a bomb to his car. He was one of 15 innocents murdered by PIRA terrorists via its' European terrorist campaign.

The bomb exploded in a British military housing area, murdering Cpl Smith and injuring his wife and three children.

The attack was the second in two weeks on British military personnel in West Germany.

The bomb went off about 6:30 p.m. as Cpl Smith opened the door of his red Mercedes while his family waited to get in.

Cpl Smith was attached to the Royal Tank Regiment, he was a native of Yorkshire.

Officials said bomb disposal experts found another explosive device in the area and defused it. Residents in nearby apartment buildings were evacuated and police searched for other bombs.

This is the first occasion in almost 30 years that the family have spoken out.

Uniting Innocent Victims / Uniendo Victimas Inocentes

Lisnaskea-based South East Fermanagh Foundation (SEFF) but who recently have also established a West Tyrone Gateway Service (based from Newtownstewart) has held its' 6th Annual Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving in Ballygawley Presbyterian Church Yesterday.

This year's service had an international theme as explained by SEFF's Director of Services Kenny Donaldson. "This year marked our 6th Annual Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving and this year we brought the service to Ballygawley which has already featured significantly in the public's consciousness given that August past marked the 30th Anniversary since PIRA terrorists carried out the Ballygawley Raod bus bombing. This atrocity saw 8 innocent young soldiers of the 1st Light Infantry Regiment murdered and many others maimed (through body and mind)

"At this year's Service we dedicated a fourth Memorial Quilt. This particular quilt has strong International roots with the 15 innocents murdered by Provisional IRA terrorists across mainland Europe being remembered. These individuals were soldiers, RAF personnel, tourists, a footman, banker and even a 6 month old baby, slaughtered along with her father".

"Those murdered also came from six different nationality backgrounds; British, German, Australian, Indian, Belgian and Dutch. Meanwhile also being remembered on the Quilt will be 16 innocents of ETA terrorism, committed in Spain (principally the Basque Region) with individuals included who were born Spain and in France. All 31 names of the victims will be read out within the Service".

"SEFF and its' sister group Covite (based in Spain) each commemorate 20 years since formation this year; the Memorial Quilt Project complete with a book of testimonies from those impacted by PIRA and ETA Terrorism and with articles contributed by Prof Henry Patterson and Prof Rogelio Alonso will illustrate how terrorism has worked collaboratively across International borders and why it is important tat innocent victims/survivors of that terror should do likewise".

Mr Donaldson added: "This year's Service was conducted by Rev Nick Cooper (who has recently departed from Ballygawley to Ballygowan but who has kindly agreed to return for this particular Service) and there will be an International flavour to the Service but also a very intimate local involvement with contributions coming within the service from four families impacted by terrorism in the close proximity of Ballygawley (through readings, prayers and the sharing of testimony) SEFF's Youth choir also performed a number of pieces within the Service"

MORNING SEFF CALLING

Now that we are in October the evenings have become a lot colder, although thank goodness it hasn't been wet. There is nothing that brings the spirits down as much as cold wet dark evenings. October is also the month when the flu inoculation is offered to us by the NHS. Two of the groups that it is offered to are the over 65's and the under 65's who have a long term health condition. I myself have been getting it for the last fifteen years and can honestly say that in that time I have not had anything more serious than a mild head cold.



The flu can cause severe illness and death among vulnerable groups. This year 2018/2019 a new improved jab is to be to elderly people for the first time as the effectiveness of flu jab typically declines as people get older. This new inoculation boosts the body's immune system and is of benefit to our elderly population, protecting the against three strains of flu.

So how safe is it? Well it will not guarantee that you will be 100% flu free, however if you do take the flu after inoculation it is likely to be milder, shorter lived. Serious side effects are rare. So, apart from a sore arm, aching muscles and perhaps a mild fever, the flu inoculation has a good safety record. (Public Health England (PHE)

SEFF holds robust meeting with BBC Bosses

For some considerable time we have listened to members vent their frustrations at how they perceive Media coverage within the BBC and we have also heard the deep hurt many feel at the use of particular 'commentators' who have form in goading innocent victims/survivors of terrorism throughout comments which are beyond the pale. , we will not sit back and allow commentators like Jude Collins disrespect and demean innocent victims/survivors of terrorism

On Thursday 17th October 2018 a delegation of SEFF representatives met with the Head of BBC Northern Ireland Adam Smyth and colleagues from other BBC Programme Management teams to discuss a wide range of issues.

It is recognised by SEFF that there is a need for a positive working relationship to exist between the organisation and the Media thus enabling individual victims/survivors to have a voice and to be able to articulate their perspective within a public forum.

We engaged with the BBC on the basis of wanting to resolve the deficit which currently exists around the representation of innocent victims/survivors of terrorism within BBC Radio and Television output.

We robustly argued for further programmes to be developed which would illustrate the border experience which is rarely acknowledged within the choice of Programmes developed and screened or aired by the Corporation.

The discussion was very open and frank and we presented the BBC with solutions around how the current deficit could be bridged if the will existed on the part of The Corporation to fully represent the community in which we are all part.

We will now judge the merits of today's direct exchange in how matters develop in the times ahead.

SEFF's Welfare & Benefits Service Update

We are aware that a vast number of SEFF members who are in receipt of DLA (Disability Living Allowance) are still awaiting the transition to PIP (Personal Independence Payment).

Tina Grimsley (SEFF's Welfare Officer) along with Norman Kirkpatrick (SEFF's Appeals Officer) are available to meet with people and provide guidance around the various steps of the process and to ensure you have the information you need going forward. Please contact us before you start the process as this can have an adverse effect on your claim.

Are you currently in receipt of any of the following:-

JSA Income Based, ESA Income Based, Income Support, Working Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, Housing Benefit (Rental)

Universal Credit has been rolled out in Fermanagh and this will affect you. It will see a number of people lose their benefits or have their benefits capped.

It has to be realised that Universal Credit works differently from the benefits it replaces. Before making your claim you need to know:

Universal Credit will be paid twice a month, although you may request a monthly payment. You will be expected to make your claim online with your own personal email account.

You will receive a single payment for your household if your Universal Credit includes an amount for rent, it will be paid directly to your landlord - however, subject to certain conditions, you will be able to opt out of direct payments and arrange to pay your landlord yourself. The application has to be completed in one step it can't be saved to finish at a later time.

If you are told to change over to Universal Credit please contact SEFF's Welfare service on 028 677 23884 for assistance and make an appointment or if it just advice you wish feel free to speak to either Tina Grimsley (SEFF's Welfare Officer) or Norman Kirkpatrick (SEFF's Welfare Appeals Officer) in the near future we will also be confirming a new member to the team who will provide Welfare Advice via SEFF's West Tyrone Gateway Service.

SEFF's Annual Act of Remembrance is due to take place this year on Friday 9th November 2018 at 10.45am at SEFF's Memorial in the grounds of Holy Trinity, Church of Ireland, Lisnaskea.

Ms Anne Graham who is a sister of Queens University law lecturer and prominent Ulster Unionist Edgar Graham who was murdered by the Provisional IRA.

Linda Gilmore, formerly of South Down Action for Healing Wounds (now SEFF's South Down Gateway Service) whose father John Eakins (aged 52) was murdered on 9th February 1971 alongside Harry Edgars (26) and George Beck (43), William Thomas (35) from Wales and David Henson (24) from England, all civilians, when the Provisional IRA carried out a landmine attack while the men were travelling in a civilian landrover at Brougher Mountain, near Trillick. It was supposedly mistaken for a British Army vehicle.
