Dear Member,

The evenings are coming in much earlier as the Seasons change and at SEFF we're responding to this with a Winter Programme which we trust will give reason for members to want to come out and participate in the various programmes on offer.

I want to begin by congratulating and welcoming John Blair onboard The SEFF Team. John has been appointed SEFF's Monitoring and I.T Development Officer and we wish him well in his new role.

Of late SEFF has continued its' ongoing work of lobbying Government through holding meetings with the Minister of State for Northern Ireland, Shaleish Vara MP (who has resigned in recent days ref the ongoing BRexit saga) and Richard Benyon MP (who formerly served within the military in Northern Ireland) Our group recognises the importance of engagement with National political parties and ejected representatives and this work will continue in the coming months.

In recent times you will have noted developments in the double murder case of Jimmy Eames and Alfie Johnston and the decision taken by The PPS to prosecute John Downey for the crime. SEFF's thoughts and prayers are with the Eames and Johnston families and we commend their tenacity as well as the authorities and our own Advocacy efforts for the combined effort to date which has saw this progress within the case.

Remembrance was a particularly busy period for SEFF and you will see details enclosed which illustrate this. We were pleased to be able to involve victims/survivors who had not previously been

involved in the actual content of such events.

Back in early November we launched our Gateway Service in South Down following on from previous developments in West Tyrone and Newtownstewart, we will work in partnership with local people, and organisations within those areas in a common effort to deliver upon the needs of innocent victims/survivors of terrorism within these areas.

Appeal for book shelving: If anyone has a decent quality book shelving which you no longer require then please contact the SEFF office as we may have a means to utilise the shelving for SEFF's new Library.

We encourage members to come along to the next monthly members meeting to be held on Wednesday 28th November 2018 where we will be discussing upcoming developments.



REMEMBRANCE EVENTS IN SEFF, NOVEMBER 2018

Act of Remembrance (Lisnaskea)

On Friday 9th November 2018 SEFF service was held at SEFF's Memorial located in the grounds of Holy Trinity Church of Ireland, Lisnaskea.

Prayers were read by Hazel Little (widow of Const John McVitty) and the Bible Reading was read by Shelley Loudon (Daughter of D/Const Norman Prue) Ken Funston also read a poem adopted recently by the War Widows and the SEFF wreath was laid by Sharon Clarke (Daughter of Private Jimmy Graham BEM)

The service including formal act was presided over by SEFF's Chairman Eric Brown.

Following the Act of Remembrance attended by well over 70 people, folks then went back to SEFF offices for refreshments and there then followed two very powerful testimonies contributed by Anne Graham (sister of Edgar Graham who was a senior Ulster Unionist and Law Lecturer at Queens University Belfast) and Wendy Gibson (widow of Ned Gibson, an off duty UDR soldier).

London Remembrance

Over the weekend of Friday 9th - Monday 12th November 2018, 55 members of SEFF gathered in London for National Remembrance events with a number attending The Royal British Legions Festival of Remembrance event held in The Royal Albert Hall, folks also attended Horse Guards Parade and visited the impressive lantern display at The Tower of London. The group also laid a wreath at the cenotaph (pictures opposite).

SEFF DECEMBER CULTURAL WORKSHOP

WEDNESDAY 5TH DECEMBER 2018 AT 7.30PM

DR. Tim EASLEA MBE is originally from London, Tim enjoyed a thirty-year career of public service, in both the military and the police. Having joined the military in 1978, as an enlisted soldier in a county infantry regiment, Tim went on to serve in Northern Ireland, Germany, Kenya, the UK and in Cyprus, where he worked as part of a UN contingent.

After leaving the military he returned to Northern Ireland to join the Royal Ulster Constabulary (RUC), serving initially as a Response Officer. Between 1988 and 2004 Tim worked as an operational Detective, recruiting and handling Covert Human Intelligence Sources (CHIS) in order to address the national security threat emanating from Irish Republican terrorist organisations, principally the Provisional IRA (PIRA). During these years, Tim was involved in a range of operations, designed to control and nullify the activities of terrorist criminals. In 2004 Tim joined the Police Service of Northern Ireland Special Operations Branch training team, to assess, select, develop and mentor personnel involved in high-risk CHIS activities. In 2005 he was awarded an MBE for his public service.

Tim will be in SEFF on Wednesday 5th December 2018 from 7.30pm to address SEFF Members on 'Special Branch; Myths and Realities of the Agent Handler's Existence' amongst other issues, Tim will reflect critically on his time as an agent handler in Belfast, his motivation for engaging with that particular role; the complexities attached to managing human sources in a conflict environment, and continuing attempts by the Irish Republican caucus to besmirch the name of the RUC (in general) and Special Branch in particular. Please do come along.

SERVICE UPDATE



We are aware that a vast number of SEFF members who are in receipt of DLA (Disability Living Allowance) are still awaiting the transition to PIP (Personal Independence Payment).

Tina Grimsley (SEFF's Welfare Officer) along with Norman Kirkpatrick (SEFF's Appeals Officer) are available to meet with people and provide guidance around the various steps of the process and to ensure you have the information you need going forward. Please contact us before you start the process as this can have an adverse effect on your claim.

If you are told to change over to Universal Credit please contact SEFF's Welfare service on 028 677 23884 for assistance and make an appointment or if it just advice you wish feel free to speak to either Tina Grimsley (SEFF's Welfare Officer) or Norman Kirkpatrick (SEFF's Welfare Appeals Officer) in the near future we will also be confirming a new member to the team who will provide Welfare Advice via SEFF's West Tyrone Gateway Service.

Meeting with Minister of State for Northern Ireland

On Monday last a SEFF delegation met with The Minister of State for Northern Ireland Shaleish Vara (who has resigned in recent days ref the ongoing BRexit saga) in Stormont House to discuss a range of victim/survivor rejected legacy related issues as well as bring the Minister up to speed with the work of the group.

Issues discussed were:

1. The need for a new UK wide definition of victim of terrorism which would incorporate terrorism in the context of The Northern Ireland Troubles.
2. The need for the Army Widows Pensions for those so brutally treated, when upon remarrying they lost the Pension formerly connected with the murder of a previous husband.
3. SEFF's wider response to the NIO Legacy Consultation.

Minister Vara was invited to come to Fermanagh to meet with members in their own backyard.

The meeting was "courteous" but also "open and frank".

Serena Hamilton (MUVE Project and daughter of murdered off duty UDR soldier David Graham)

Joe Ferguson (Vice Chair of SEFF's South Down Gateway Service sub-committee and brother of murdered RUC member; Michael Ferguson)

Anne Graham (sister of murdered Queens University Law lecturer and senior Ulster Unionist, Edgar Graham)



SEFF meet with Richard Benyon MP

On Monday last SEFF representatives met with Richard Benyon MP (ex military) at Westminster to discuss a range of issues affecting the ex military constituency and the broader constituency of victims/survivors.

Amongst issues discussed were:

1. UK wide definition of victim of terrorism.
2. SEFF concerns around a Statute of Limitations for ex military.
3. SEFF engagement with former Regular Army personnel and families in bringing them back to Northern Ireland and need for additional resources.
4. Need for restoration of Pension for cohort of War Widows.
5. Military Covenant and its restricted limitation in Northern Ireland.
6. SEFF's GB support service for innocent victims/survivors of terrorism.

Mr Benyon was invited to come to Northern Ireland to address a SEFF meeting and to meet with ex military personnel and other victims/survivors of terrorism.

The meeting was "constructive" and a "good start" in building a future relationship.

SEFF's South Down Gateway Service



On Wednesday 7th November 2018 a new support service for victims and survivors of terrorism was launched in Rathfriland.

The new initiative is the work of Lisnaskea-based South East Fermanagh Foundation (SEFF) who have worked in partnership with local people in recent months in an effort to see continuance of services post the dissolution of South Down Action for Healing Wounds.

An annual Act of Remembrance took place where local people alongside visitors met to remember the dead of two world wars as well as those killed in Wars and Conflict since.

Those murdered as a consequence of the terrorist campaign (in the Northern Ireland context) were also given prominent Remembrance with poppy crosses laid in acknowledgment of their sacrifices.

The service was officiated by Rev Alan Irwin (of Colaghty, Lack Church of Ireland, County Fermanagh) There then followed the formal launch of SEFF's South Down Gateway Service. Speaking of the launch, Director of Services Kenny Donaldson stated:

"We were very encouraged by the large turnout for the launch. A very moving and fitting Act of Remembrance focusing on the legacy of terrorism in the context of The Northern Ireland Troubles but which also reflected upon the sacrifices of those killed in the Great War - 100 years on since the ending of that War, there then followed the formal launch of the new victim/survivor support initiative".

"SEFF's Chairman Eric Brown, myself as Director of Services and Pete Murtagh, Advocacy Support Worker for the area gave addresses concerning the new service where we pointed to the need for partnership between our group and the local community of South Down and Lagan Valley in best delivering for victims/survivors. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the sub-committee, Fran Gilmore and

Joe Ferguson also leant their support and commitment to the new initiative".

"Among those attending were local elected representatives, local clergy and many innocent victims/survivors of terrorism from the local area and further afield".

"The most poignant part of the event was without doubt the contributions of Rev Alan Irwin whose father Thomas Irwin and Uncle Frederick Irwin were murdered in separate acts of terrorism and Michelle Williamson whose parents were also murdered by Provisional IRA terrorists - George and Gillian Williamson via the Shankill Bomb. Both testimonies were very powerful and painfully illustrated the legacy of terrorism, the ongoing destruction it causes. Both speakers did however signal messages of resilience and of hope - both determined that terrorism will not victor".

On Remembrance Sunday, a poppy wreath was laid at the cenotaph on Rathfriland by a representative from SEFF's South Down Gateway Service.

The new Gateway Service is now open and victims/survivors from throughout the South Down and Lagan Valley are encouraged to engage. They can do so via calling: 028 677 23884 where Rathfriland based staff will be available to provide assistance or alternatively people are encouraged to call into the offices located at 16a Downpatrick street, Rathfriland.

South Down Service Delivery

The first month of the new service has been and gone and members are beginning to realise that the Office is now open during the week, since the start of the month there has been an increase in people dropping in during the day for a chat and a cuppa.

We are hoping to hold a Coffee Morning in January 2019, this will be discussed at the next Sub-Committee meeting which will take place on Monday 3rd December 2018. We will also agree a new date for the day respite/ border tour to Fermanagh which will also now take place in the New Year.

Complementary Therapies are ongoing in the Rathfriland Office at present and will continue over the next number of weeks.

We would be very interested to hear of any ideas from members in relation to potential classes, courses and activities you would like to see run through this new service for example Craft, IT based learning or photography. Befriending Service



As a result of evident need, SEFF intends to develop a Befriending Service as part of our West Tyrone Gateway Service outreach. We would intend the service to go live on 1st April 2019 with training being provided to volunteers over the January - March 2019 period.

The service will seek to support those most vulnerable and isolated through home visits, accompanying to events, hospital transportation etc.

We are appealing for anyone willing to give 6-8 hours of voluntary time per week to contact our West Tyrone Gateway service on: 028 677 23884 or to speak to any of our staff who are based in Newtown Stewart.

We are seeking to appoint a Coordinator who would have administrative responsibility for managing a team of 4-5 befrienders who would in turn support members/befriendees.

The person to be appointed as Coordinator should have a good understanding of administration and general policies and procedures concerning working with/supporting vulnerable people. Befrienders should have qualities such as empathetic, caring, confidential, have access to transport and most importantly, have good communicative skills.

Expressions of interest are asked to be submitted by 5pm on Friday 14th December 2018 at the latest. SEFF's existing Befriending Service Coordinators will be involved in the selection and appointments process.

Morning SEFF Calling

FACT NOVEMBER 2018 UPDATE

All classes across both Counties are continuing and are fully subscribed, i.e. swimming, crafts, I Pad classes, exercise, gardening, etc.

Kenny, Jenny & Gladys will be involved in meetings in the coming weeks with different agencies to promote and continue our work with securing funding to continue the FACT Project in some form, when our funding finishes in July 2019. So far the meetings that have been attended have been positive, but we still have a lot of work to do.

The CDHN Community Partnership Programme has been completed by Armagh members. Certificates were presented (see photo opposite). This programme has been hugely successful and members-led. A wide range of relevant topics have been covered, such as The Use of Statins, The Need for Extra Supplements, To Get or Not to Get Flu Vaccines?, IpiPen Instructions, Keeping Medicine Details Safe for Emergency Services, Blood Pressure and Glucose Sugar Testing, Sleep (The Good Sleep Guide), etc. Aware NI was the community/voluntary partner, and provided very useful information on how to recognise and cope with depression on an everyday level. Lots of questions were answered in a relaxed atmosphere.



Gladys has linked up with Wheelworks in Belfast and is hopeful of running an IT Intergenerational Project in Armagh in the New Year.

Jenny has attended the Train the Trainer Course for Action Mental Health and is qualified to deliver "Chronic Pain Clinics" and "Managing a Long-Term Condition" to Community groups within the Western Trust.

A day of celebration was recently held at Cleenish for all the ladies who completed the Managing the Challenge Course. Certificates were presented by Brenda Burns, Tutor, and local celebrity George Thornton. 25 ladies attended and enjoyed their "Graduation", with the usual cream teas served. (see photo opposite)



Gladys & Jenny have attended PCSP Conferences in both counties and felt that it was good for networking with other agencies.

We look forward to our Winter which is on 31st January 2019 in The Killyhevlin Hotel. The agenda for this will be a Fashion Show, Choir participation, and a Fire Safety brief. Wee Tom will also entertain.


