Dear Member.

We continue to live in challenging times, it's now referred to as "restricted living" and yes there have been many sacrifices requiring made by all of us to a greater or lesser degree over this period but what is also clear is that there have been many blessings also as families and individuals have been forced to re-evaluate and slow down the pace of their lives.

Within SEFF we have played our part in supporting the efforts of the NHS through donation £1,000 to the WHSCT for the benefit of frontline workers, many of our members are also making masks and other PPE related items for hospital staff but also for nursing homes and other carers within the community.

We also took the decision to retain an office presence in support of our members, we did not think it right to close up and cease to have that presence.

As things stand we as a Region are getting through these darkest days, but it is not without a cost. Principally the human cost of lives stolen away through the virus or indeed, lives and health adversely impacted for the medium term as a result of the contracting of the virus. There has also and will continue to be a huge economic cost (which none of us yet know the full scale) and it remains unclear as to when we will be able to return to delivering services as we would have pre the COVID-19 breakout.

We will continue to keep you updated through this N'letter when we hear of developments, but be assured SEFF has not ground to a standstill, in many ways the organisation is as busy as ever, it's just a new type of busy.

We want to hear from you if you have welfare queries, if you feel you need the support which can be offered by telephone-based counselling, if you feel a weekly telephone call would be helpful to you, if you need a grocery drop, if you wish to speak to an advocacy or health and wellbeing caseworker; remember all these individuals are still being paid to support you (and their numbers are contained on page 2)

Please DO NOT SUFFER in silence, WE ARE HERE TO HELP and we will do discretely.

Within this N'letter there are multiple references to various initiatives which we're offering via our Facebook page and which will also be made available through the SEFF Website, please do engage with us over this difficult time.

On Friday 8th May 2020 SEFF will be paying its' own special tribute marking the 75th Anniversary of VE Day (Victory on Europe) when the Allied Forces finally brought Germany to the point of surrender. We MUST adopt a similar determination with this new opponent, COVID-19 will also be defeated.

RENEWING SEFF Membership 2020/21

We are fast approaching the new membership year at SEFF; **1st July 2020.**We would like, where possible that as many of you renew your membership through a **Standing Order** process so that you don't need to be reminded each year to pay your fees and therefore you won't miss out on the chance of availing of our many services and activities if not up to date with your membership.

If you cannot do **STANDING ORDER** through your bank, we accept payments for subscriptions by either cheque or cash.

If you want to set up a **standing order** please call the office and we will give you the bank details for SEFF needed to set up a standing order through your bank. **Regrettably we cannot do card payments over the phone or in the office.**Membership fees are as follows: £10 per adult

Post primary school age (12 - 16 yrs old) is £5 each and under 11's are free.

I also want to recognise and thank our funders; The Victims and Survivors Service - To Margaret Bateson and her Team, thank you for your leadership through these difficult times.

SEFF is a grassroots organisation which has selfless volunteers who believe in our ethos. Our hope is that these short tribute pieces will offer some comfort to families that their loved ones are being remembered by the Big SEFF Family.

Update through COVID-19

The Dept of Communities suspended reviews and reassessments for health and disability benefits for the next three months. These measures are to reassure vulnerable people and their families about the continuity of their benefits during the Coronavirus outbreak and to ensure the Department's resources are focused on enabling access to financial support for people who need it.

Explaining further, the Dept said: "These new measures are in addition to the suspension of face-to-face assessments for all benefits which were announced last week. They are effective from today for a three month period and will see the suspension of:

- 1. All new reviews and reassessments for Personal Independence Payment;
- 2. All re-referrals for Work Capability Assessments across Employment Support Allowance and Universal Credit. People in receipt of ESA and UC whose cases have been referred to the provider will be contacted to take this forward;
- 3. All reassessment/renewal activity on other health and disability benefits including Industrial Injuries Disablement Benefit, Disability Living Allowance for both children and those aged 65+, and Attendance Allowance.

Arrangements will be put in place to extend awards that have an end date to ensure benefit remains in payment. If people experience a change in their needs they are still encouraged to contact the Department to ensure they are receiving the correct level of support.
