1. SEFF member's experiences through drama

Playwright Jonathan Burgess has been appointed to work with SEFF volunteers and members in writing a short drama depicting the various issues that victims/survivors have faced in these areas. The purpose of the drama is to educate new audiences as to the unique border experience and the anti-violence belief system which was at the heart of those living within these areas.

On Wednesday 11th May there will be an information event held at SEFF from 7pm onwards which Jonathan Burgess will be present. He will also be showing extracts from a recent UDR drama play that he was involved with. We ask for would be actors and those willing to speak to Jonathan to share some local perspectives to come along on this night. Jonathan will then be back at SEFF all day on Saturday 14th May 2016 to engage with our members around their experiences of terrorism in these areas and we appeal for your participation. 2. SEFF Families Recording Project

Hi All,



SEFF's Advocacy Service

The AfIV service continues to work behind the scenes on a number of projects.

Advocacy Support – helping to clarify and identify members' problems, providing you with factual information and support, listening with respect, exploring and evaluating options and communicating clearly in a way that the person understands and agrees with the course that the advocate is taking.

We are seeking to gather as much information as possible on individual cases to highlight the inadequacies of previous investigations and forward these to the proposed Historical Investigation Unit (HIU). We would encourage anyone with a HET report that they feel was inadequate to arrange a meeting with Ken to see if there are any issues that can be tak-

Research – it is important that the advocate role is associated and reinforced by a level of research that means that the correct information is available to support all cases.

There is a revisionist strategy taking place, where the history that as we know it, is being rewritten by those with a narrow selfish political agenda, and this is a very real attack on our way of life. This must be challenged by us with the production of documents and information that refutes the consistent argument by republicans that the main cause of the Troubles was the British state supported by Unionism and the Security Forces.

Highlighting Innocent Victims Issues - It is inherently wrong that the inquiry into the death of a terrorist by whatever means, is classed as more important than the murder of our innocent loved ones. The suspicion of collusion is being used to further the aims of groups who do not have victims and survivors best interests at heart. They are pursuing the furtherance of these aims by abusing the laxity of British law to gain full access to state documents.

Presently there does appear to be a hierarchy of victims, and those who wished to do us harm are being classed as the most important; we must work at changing that. The brother of a man allegedly murdered by the army agent, Freddie Scappaticci, stated recently, "The thing that I feel is really strange is that everyone is talking about Scappaticci, but ultimately what about the people who actually pulled the triggers? It just seems like they are getting a free pass. So, to me, the whole thing just smacks of being almost this inquiry to use as a political football to beat the British government with." We must continue to be proactive, the noble course of seeking redress for the families of innocent victims will continue, and it is not something that will be easy.

Border Trials project - The Enniskillen, West Fermanagh and North Fermanagh Trials are nearing completion and if anyone has any anecdotes or oral accounts they would like to contribute please feel free to e-mail Matthew (matthew.gault@seff.org.uk) or call in to the office. We are excited to announce that sections of the Border Trials are to be filmed to highlight the experiences of those who lived in the Border regions. It is hoped that these Trials will educate individuals on the real effects of terrorism and can be used as an educational tool for schools and community groups.

Ann has been volunteering with this service, since its start in September 2015. This valuable service has been steadily growing, as means of supporting our members well being, referring them onto other services within SEFF, and reminding them of forthcoming events in the SEFF calendar.



Colin Dickenson and Aland McManus from the "Good Morning Network" came to SEFF recently, and delivered a training day for volunteers with the Morning SEFF Calling service. The main aspects of the course covered the role and responsibilities of our (telephone) calling volunteers, where confidentiality, empathy and willingness to make a difference are key. We also looked at what makes someone "vulnerable" and how we may deal with their vulnerabilities and offer support, when making a call.

SEFF is keen to recruit more volunteers for this service. A weekly telephone call can make such a difference to someone who is vulnerable and isolated - for whatever reason. Remember, someone's life could be a bit better tomorrow, with you being in it today. All SEFF needs is a regular commitment of up to 3 hours a week from you. We are also considering extending the Service to provide an evening phonecall option on Wednesday evenings from 6pm-8.30pm.




