We hosted families of the 1st Bn Royal Regiment of Fusiliers who were back in Fermanagh for a Memorial dedication unveiling to their loved ones. We've continued our lobbying work with Government, statutory agencies and others and we have continued to deliver the services and programmes which you, the members have come to value and utilise .

Next month's Newsletter will feature reports on a Residential that SEFF are attending at The Glencree Peace Centre, Wicklow with the leaderships of our main Churches and much more.

Drama Project

Playwright Jonathan Burgess has been appointed to work with SEFF volunteers and members, in writing a short drama depicting the various issues that victims/survivors have faced in these areas. The purpose of the drama is to educate new audiences as to the unique border experience and the anti-violence belief system which was at the heart of those living within these areas.

Jonathan has been speaking to members within SEFF and has material now in place to assist in the preparation of a script. We appeal for would be actors within SEFF's membership to come forward to indicate your interest in becoming involved with this Project. You do not have to have had any previous acting experience.

RENEWING SEFF MEMBERSHIP 2016/17

We are fast approaching the new membership year at SEFF; 1st July 2016. Payments for renewing can be made by either cheque, cash or standing orders from your bank account. If you wish to set up a standing order please obtain a standing order mandate from your bank and then call the office and we will give you the required bank details for SEFF needed to complete the form. Regrettably we cannot do card payments over the phone or in the office.

Since the introduction of our membership some of your details may have changed ie: address/mobile/phones/ postcodes etc.

Enclosed for each household are two new membership forms (if required) which we would appreciate that you complete with ALL the relevant details included on the forms along with your renewal fee.

Membership fees are as follows: £10 per adult renewing in the household. Post primary school age (12 - 16 yrs old) is £5 each and under 11's are free.

August will be the last month that we will send out SEFF newsletters to all those on the current 2015/16 membership database before we implement the updated 2016/17 mailing list.

Uster Scot Summer Schools

SEFF has applied to the Ulster Scots Agency for funding of the following Summer Schemes for young people.

The annual summer school, will be for sixty 7 to 16 year olds and will be held in Lisnaskea High School over five days, from Monday 25th to Friday 29th July 2016. The scheme will be jammed packed with activities over the five days, with a trip to the Siege Museum in Londonderry planned.

Subject to funding, we are also planning a Youth Residential Weekend at the Rosscor Youth Village, near Belleek from Friday 12th to Sunday 14th August, for up to thirty 11 to 18 year olds.

If music and drama appeal, we are also organising two Drama Schools this August.

The first is from 1st to 5th August 2016, and is angled towards juniors from the ages of 7 to 14 years. We anticipate that this will be held in Brookeborough Primary School over the week. This drama school is based on a play by the popular Ulster Scots Playwright Dan Gordon, and will be exploring Ulster Scots Culture and language through an Agricultural themed play.

The second scheme will be a Senior musical, aimed at twenty 15 to 18 year olds. We are hoping that this will take place at Enniskillen Integrated College. *More information to follow soon.*

Family Respite Weekend

We are currently planning a weekend family respite trip to the Carrowmena Activity Centre, near Limavady.

This will take place over the weekend Friday 5th to Sunday 7th August 2016, \$\phi\$ will be for up to 30 SEFF members (10-12 adults 18-20 Children).

The accommodation at Carrowmena is a mixture of cabins and glamping pods, and offers activities such as a Climbing Wall, Zip Line and Archery sessions. There will also be an opportunity for folk to have a day out in Portrush. The price per person is £50 per adult and £25 per child under 12 years old.


SEFF raised a range of pertinent issues relevant to innocent victims and survivors.

SEFF and Fermanagh welcomes back the families of the 1st Bn Royal Regiment of Fusiliers

Kenny explains: "We committed to the families last September that we would unveil a plaque and personalised photo montage to honour their loved ones and that this would be erected in the Legion Hall. We are indebted to Enniskillen RBL who said yes without hesitation".

"The weekend has been difficult for the families returning to Northern Ireland and Fermanagh and a number came with heavy and hurting hearts. We pray that they leave this weekend with a knowledge that very many people in County Fermanagh care about them and their welfare".

"The evil perpetrated 32 years ago on Wednesday last against off duty soldiers enjoying a day's fishing in the tranquil surroundings of County Fermanagh was an act of cowardice and opportunism - it was not done in the name of the vast majority of the community, it was done by a terror movement whose ideology was and is wedded to ethnic and sectarian hatred".

"SEFF will continue to reach out to the families of Regular British Army soldiers who are hurting in silence throughout GB and who have unfinished business with this place. Because of their sacrifices and others Northern Ireland remains free and its' people have hope of something better".

"Whilst the family representatives were staying in Fermanagh they were brought out for a boat trip on the Lough where they were shown the area where their loved ones fished that fateful day, they also visited Marble Arch Caves, received therapy treatments and were involved in a SEFF meeting with The Minister of State for Northern Ireland Ben Wallace MP (who himself is an ex-military man with three tours completed in Northern Ireland)

"Thanks go out to all those who made the weekend possible; the volunteer drivers, the folks at the Legion, Rev Alan Irwin, Bob and Avril Lyons, Venton Dunwoody who designed the plaque and many, many others. SEFF's army of volunteers kicked in as always".

IVU-UPDATE

<u>Event</u>: hustings event was held with political parties who contested the upcoming Assembly election on Thursday 21st April 2016

Those who contributed were:

8 core needs of the IVU constituency which we seek your support for and your Party's commitment to further:

- 1. Commitment from your Party to examine current legislation around the glorification of terrorism with a view to introducing more robust legislation which carries with it robust sentencing.
- 2. Commitment from your Party to examine current legal aid structures and the imbalance which exists in terms of those cases supported with State sponsorship.
- 3. That your Party will redouble its' efforts around the provision of a special Pension for the seriously injured insisting that those who were injured at their own hand are not supported through any 'official direct scheme' introduced by the Government.
- 4. That your Party will support the re-instating and backdating of pensions for UDR Widows and other Army Widows who re-married. Army Widows should be treated no differently to Police or Prison Office widows.
- 5. That your Party will support IVU's campaign for a change to the 'Definition of Victim.' If this cannot be resolved through existing legislative structures that your Party would examine with others the potential for a Public Referendum to be held on the issue.
- 6. Commit your Party to never provide support for the development of a 'Conflict Transformation Centre' at the former Maze Prison site, whether this year, next year or in the medium-longer term.
- 7. In the event of a BRexit that your Party would lobby National Government strongly ensuring that comparable financial resources as being made available via Peace IV are made available to enable envisaged work programmes supporting victims and survivors to be taken forward.
- 8. That your Party will fight for the innocent victims and survivors of Gaddafi sponsored PIRA terrorism insisting that the current legal writ is furthered but also that a pool of finance is in place to support the needs of victims/survivors of PIRA terrorism across the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland supporting such individual's advocacy, health and wellbeing and other practical needs.

IVU-UPDATE

IVU seeks support for its' agenda

In a statement Kenny Donaldson, IVU Spokesman stated: "IVU felt it important to hold a seminar discussion where we would appraise local political parties contesting the forthcoming `N.I Assembly election about the needs of our members with a view to securing their support and commitment to further these issues".

"Within our opening address we presented 8 core needs for IVU's constituency of victims and survivors and we secured the full backing of the TUV, UKIP and DUP representatives on these issues with the SDLP and UUP representatives also associating themselves with the content and committing to liaise with their Party leaderships around IVU's agenda for change".

"IVU made clear to the panellists the sheer frustration and sense of injustice which permeates across many innocent victims and survivors of terrorism who feel that unresolved murder cases concerning their loved ones are given mere lip service and are treated very differently to those cases where there is alleged involvement and responsibility from individual members of the Security Forces/the State".

"The case was made very strongly of the need for properly resourced advocacy infrastructure which would enable the IVU constituency to be best represented in the event of the new HIU and other legacy structures being legislated for".

Mr Donaldson added: "The gathering were encouraged by the commitments given by all four of the Unionist candidates that no 'Conflict Transformation Centre' would be positioned on the former Maze Prison site this year, next year or in the medium-longer term - that this issue was non negotiable".


