We've had a very busy spell at SEFF over the past few weeks with a number of excellent events completed including, a Reception event held in Trinity College Dublin via The Terrorism knows NO Borders Project.'

This event was particularly focused on providing an opportunity for Rol-based victims/survivors to come together in solidarity and to experience the support of The SEFF family.

The event was attended by large numbers of senior individuals from throughout RoI Society including, the Head of the Irish Army and a senior Garda representative. Our thanks go to all those who participated in any way to what was a dignified and memorable evening.

Since our last Newsletter went out the SEFF family has however been bereaved by a number of its' members. Locally and most tragically was the loss of 18-year-old Kirsty Clarke, and our love and continued prayers are with the Clarke/Graham family circle.

We were also bereaved of Una Moffit who was to speak at this year's SEFF Conference, Una was in her early 70's and was a lady - she had borne much in her life in losing a brother, murdered by loyalist terrorists and then having her family owned business blew up and targeted by both republican and loyalist terrorists. (In fact it was her family business - Balmoral Furniture which was blown up by Bobby Sands and his fellow terrorist 'comrades')

SEFF is a family of people from across the religious and political spectrum so as such we do not advise people to vote in any specific way - we simply suggest that you would use your franchise on 2nd March 2017 and ensure that you vote for those candidates who you have confidence will pursue and advance victim and survivor issues.

Pease use your vote fully by voting down your ballot. The best advice (without prejudice) we can give is, keep voting down until your conscience will not allow you to go any further.

As yet we do not have confirmation of funding from 1st April 2017 onwards, within next month's Newsletter we will be able to advise of the state of play on this issue as well as hopefully provide some clarity to those who receive individual support awards via VSS.

We would urge a large attendance at our next monthly meeting taking place on Wednesday 22nd February 2017 @ 7.30pm where Raymond Farrell will be in attendance to speak on matters of mental health and trauma and the need for reform and further investment in these support interventions and responses.

Border Trails – The border trails are complete, and the filming of identified incidents took place over the last two weeks, providing a Border Trail of all of Fermanagh.

With your support, some of you have kindly allowed me access to your HET reports. If there is anyone else who would like me to review their report, please contact the office. I am building a library of reports that will allow me to establish a pattern of neglect by the HET, and create a strong challenge to the new HIU when it becomes established.

There is an AfIV good practice day organised for Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> February. If you have availed of or worked in any way with AfIV, please contact us if you would like to attend. There will be various pick-ups and drop-offs on the routes their and back.

We are travelling to Bangor to meet with Decorum NI (mostly retired members of the Security Forces) where there will be presentations by both Decorum and AfIV. We then will move on for a visit to Schomberg House of Orange, Lunch, and then a trip on the Lagan.

#### Can we be Reconciled?

I wrote previously on the emotive point of reconciliation and the current agenda of Sinn Fein.

They recently produced a document entitled, "Towards an Agreed and Reconciled Future" Within that document they made clear their desired agenda, "In ending partition and engaging with its impact, legacy and aftermath, it is vital if we are to deal with the past and build an agreed and reconciled future." They never refer to truth and justice, it is not part of their strategy as they will not want to potentially leave their members exposed to prosecution for their previous crimes. The document continues at length to accuse others, never acknowledging the criminality of the IRA and how wrong it was to commit murder no matter what the perceived injustices were. Quite simply, the victims of the IRA don't count.

The reality is reconciliation cannot happen in isolation. The book "Sin, Forgiveness and Reconciliation, Christian & Muslim Perspectives", theorises on reconciliation and states that it will always be difficult without first, the wrongdoings being exposed and judged. It adds that to forgive and forget is almost impossible. Forgetting can be nothing more than a way of increasing negative memories, leaving the victim with enmity and hatred. Archbishop Desmond Tutu is regularly misquoted but one of his most profound statements is, "Truth is at the heart of reconciliation, the need to find out the truth about the horrors of the past, best ensure they never happen again. Without it people have no sense of safety, no trust, no confidence in the future."

Luke 17:3 states "Take heed to yourselves: If thy brother trespass against thee, rebuke him; and if he repent, forgive him." We struggle with the past because we don't know what took place, we have no answers. Our society will struggle to move forward whilst the perpetrators of heinous crimes continue to be rewarded in an unjust society. The past models our future, with an unresolved past it seems impossible to have that perfect future.

Sinn Fein and Martin McGuinness need to understand that meeting members of the Royal Family is purely symbolic, it is an emblematic carefully orchestrated manoeuvre to convey some sense of change on their part; we are not so easily convinced. If you so desire reconciliation Mr McGuinness, we need to hear about your past before you leave this earth.

#### Dublin Reception Event for 'Terrorism knows NO Borders' Project, Trinity College, Friday 10th February 2017

At a reception held in Trinity College Dublin on Friday evening, to launch a commemorative quilt remembering victims of the 'Troubles' living in Great Britain, Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland, South East Fermanagh Foundation's (SEFF) Di-



rector of Services Kenny Donaldson said: "This is part of our efforts to remember victims and their families, across the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland, under the theme "Terrorism Knows No Borders".

Discussing the Irish Government's response to the Troubles legacy, Mr Donaldson went on to say, "We are concerned at the lack of effort during the Troubles by elements within the Dublin government to prevent terrorism and its part in the creation of PIRA. There are many other questions which remain unanswered. Its failure to acknowledge its actions and inactions during that awful time remains a cause of concern for our members and borderland families."

Mr Donaldson acknowledged all the dedicated work that SEFF members

undertook in producing the Memorial saying: "Memorial Quilts have a long history in commemoration and play an important part in bringing communities together and of humanising those who have been murdered - they get behind the badge and stereotype and uncover the individual person."

One of the speakers at the event, Dr Finian Fallon, a son of Garda Richard Fallon who was murdered in Dublin by a Republican gang during the Troubles said, "The Irish government was not an innocent party in the Troubles, it was one of the main protagonists."

Discussing his father's murder, Dr Fallon said, "I believe that the gun that killed my father was imported by the Irish state. The Irish state is now engaged in a "hidden history" approach to addressing legacy issues from the Troubles: effectively nothing is being done to address injustices during the Troubles in the South."

Craig Agar, son of murdered British Army soldier Thomas Agar who also shared his testimony added: "It was an immense honour for me to share my family's experiences of terrorism amongst others who have similarly suffered and who come from across the community, throughout Ireland (north and south) and beyond".

"My message to the Trinity gathering was that the criminal justice and political institutions and agencies in place supposedly to serve the interests of justice have conclusively failed victims of terrorism and that this must be changed".

"As a GB-based victim I am also deeply frustrated at the lack of support options for my family and others like us. But for the support we have been given by our friends in Northern Ireland we would know little of the rights and entitlements that we have. The public in Great Britain by and large fail to relate to issues connected to 'The Troubles.'

"I have made new friendships and relationships this weekend and will seek to build on what has now been started. I won't be fobbed off any more, I and so many others deserve better - much better. Let us never forget, 'Peace is not the absence of Terrorism, but the presence of Justice,' concluded Mr Agar.

Also attending the SEFF gathering in TCD, Austin Stack, son of the murdered chief prison officer of Portlaoise Jail, said, "The Irish Government has blocked the Independent Victim and Survivor Coali-

tion (IVSC) from receiving the support of the Victims & Survivors Service which victims in the north have access to."

He was concerned with this saying, "This is a clear case of discrimination against those who have suffered in the Republic." and continued, "There are families in the south devastated by the Troubles but the Irish Government are providing no practical support and are inactive regarding our plight."

Senator Gerard Craughwell gave the Keynote address. As well as the Memorial Quilt which honours those murdered from Great Britain and the Republic of Ireland, a Book and DVD containing 25 testimonies from victims/ survivors across both jurisdictions was launched.



SEFF has sought for a number of years to raise the plight of Rol and GB-based victims/survivors who have not been receiving equitable access to the services which Northern Ireland-based victims/survivors have been able to access. SEFF will continue to push these issues in partnership with groupings and individuals based in The Republic of Ireland and Great Britain. No victim/survivor should be disadvantaged on the basis **6**f their given postal address.
