

Dear Member,

2017 is really in full swing at this stage, St Patrick's Day takes place tomorrow as this Newsletter is distributed.

We've had a hectic March to date which is the usual form as we seek to close down programmes for 2016/2017 whilst also trying to plan for the forthcoming period.

I have good news to report in this regard, SEFF has secured a further three years funding with an 8% increase on our 2016/2017 Victim and Survivor Programme budget. Whilst we applied for a larger amount of funding we are confident that we can do a service fitting to you our membership on what has been awarded. Budget constraints within the overall sectoral meant that 8% capped increases were standard for all those groups who made the grade in their funding bids.

We have even better news to report in terms of our Peace IV funding bid, SEFF secured everything it requested - 4 Advocacy Case Officers and 2 Health and Wellbeing Caseworkers, it is anticipated that these positions plus an I.T/Monitoring Development Officer (funded under VSP) will be advertised in the near future.

With the closing of Programmes there are always changes and this is true within the Advocacy Service where we say goodbye to Matthew Gault who was the Research/Admin p/time Officer. Matthew's contribution has been noteworthy since he took up the position but unfortunately this post ceases as a result of the new funding call.

The only other matters I wish to briefly speak on is to thank all those who gave so much in ensuring that this year's SEFF Conference went off so well - to staff, volunteers, contributors and attendees, the organisation says a very heartfelt thank you to you all.

And as referred within The Newsletter we would ask that members turn out in large numbers on Monday night to support the Clarke and Graham families for an event marking the life and contribution of a special young woman - Kirsty Clarke.

## ***SEFF Victim's Seminar***

### ***Reclaiming the Past, Shaping the Future Victims Conference in Fermanagh***

On Saturday 4th March 2017 an important Seminar was held in Fermanagh under the theme, 'Reclaiming the Past, Shaping the Future'.

Kenny Donaldson, SEFF's Director of Services stated: "Northern Ireland is in a state of paralysis due to the flawed belief that 'The Past' can somehow be dealt with separately from 'The Present' and 'The Future.' Victims and survivors have paid a very heavy price over the years of the terror campaign losing loved ones, their limbs and in some cases, their wits".

"With the rollout of the Peace Process (viewed by many as the appeasement of terrorism process) victims and survivors continued to be the constituency to pay the heavy price. Today in 2017 victims and survivors continue to pay the price through being expected to carry the burden of injustice. This in no small part is brought about by the incessant campaign of historical rewrite of 'The Troubles.'

"The Seminar explored from an academic, faith, legal and practical basis how the integrity of The Past might be reclaimed and the Future shaped meaning that victims and survivors can live once again instead of simply existing".

"We were delighted to have such a distinguished group of speakers who included, Prof Thomas Hennessey, former Archbishop of Armagh within the Church of Ireland, Rev Alan Harper, Matthew Jury of McCue and Partners Solicitors, The Victims Commissioner Judith Thompson and many others with the focus of the Seminar's acknowledgement being for Judith Jenkins (widow of Jeffrey Young) who was murdered as a consequence of the Hyde Park bombing - Mrs Jenkins' powerful contribution received a standing ovation from the Seminar delegates of which there were some 120".

Mr Donaldson added: "Meanwhile on Friday evening we were honoured to also have four individual victims/survivors murdered as a consequence of republican or loyalist terrorism from Northern Ireland, Republic of Ireland, Great Britain and Spain share testimony - Ann McCabe supported by daughter Stacey (widow and daughter of Garda Jerry McCabe) Mark Rodgers (son of Council worker Mark Rodgers murdered at Kennedy Way, Belfast) Geraldine Ferguson (mother of Patrick Azimkar, murdered at Massareene Barracks, Antrim) and Josu Pueles Garcia (brother of the last Policeman murdered by ETA in 2009, Spain)

"Against the backdrop of there being limited chance of terrorists who committed pre 1998 crimes being held accountable through the criminal justice system it is ever more necessary that Societal Justice prevails - that means preserving the core fundamental principle that whatever grievance (perceived or real) that an individual or group of people may have felt that there was never justification for the taking of life in the advancement of or defence of a 'so-called political objective' concluded Mr Donaldson.

## SEFF's Advocacy Service

### Research Update

The Border Trails are still being reviewed before the written material can be produced to the public. The filming has been completed for the four areas, and the following provided commentary for that filming and will be in a position to guide visitors on any future border tours –

- **South Fermanagh** – Eric Brown
- **West Fermanagh** – Howard Brooker
- **North Fermanagh** – Ken Funston
- **Enniskillen** – Brian Johnston

A meeting was held with "Brilliant Trails" to discuss online/digital ways to get the message of the Trails out to the wider public.

Historical statistics work carries on slowly in the background. Work on creating a list of incidents to mark out the large map is nearly completed; once complete, the map can be marked and a digital version can be displayed on the SEFF website. Unfortunately, due to the size of the map, there is no ideal place to display it fully at this present time.

We continue to improve on the standard of the SEFF website, adding information as required, creating a better experience for the viewer.

### Casework Update

The AfiV advocacy service is now engaging with almost sixty families, and that list is growing. The support required by them varies from simple enquiries to multi-faceted casework.

### Conference

A very successful conference took place on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> March in the Killyhevlin Hotel. Over 100 delegates took part with notable presentations

given by Matt Jury, Tom Hennessey, and Alan Harper. Their musings were thought provoking, leading to an interesting debate immediately after, and also during the afternoon 'break-out' sessions.

### Good Practice Visit

Approximately 25 members attached to the AfiV project visited Decorum in Bangor, and presentations were made by members of both organisation. The combined group of about 40 then paid a visit to the House of Orange, had lunch in Belfast and then had a boat-tip on the Lagan. Friendships were made and hopefully the cordiality between the organisations will continue.

AfiV continues to build on its identity within the innocent victims' sector. We once again encourage you to engage with the service, no matter how big or small the query. We need your support for AfiV to be a success.

## European Victim's Day at Stormont

Monday 13th March 2017



On Monday past a packed bus set off from Fermanagh to attend European Victim's Day at Stormont. This event began after the Madrid bombings of 2004 and is now an annual event at Stormont organised by Jim Allister TUV MLA and co sponsored by the UUP and SDLP.

As with previous years IVU were involved in organising the speakers. This year David Kelly whose father, an Irish Army Soldier was murdered in 1983 gave his testimony to a packed Senate Chamber. He talked of the hurt within his own family, his father, Patrick was an army private and was murdered while searching for kidnapped Don Tidey along the Fermanagh-Leitrim Border.

Noel Downey spoke for the first time spoke about the injuries he sustained when a booby trap bomb exploded as he went to get into his car outside a pub in Lisnaskea in 1990. Noel lost his left leg in the explosion. Noel spoke about the devastation to himself and his family and how his injuries changed his life forever, he also paid tribute to his wife Helen who he said "stood by him throughout".

Ken Funston (SEFF's Advocacy Manager) spoke on what was the 33rd anniversary since his brother, Ronnie's murder. Ronnie was 28 years old when he was murdered while working on his farm near Pettigo, nobody has ever been brought to justice for his murder. Ronnie had retired from the UDR some 8 years before he was targeted which further proves that the IRA were engaged in a campaign of ethnic cleansing in the border areas of Fermanagh.

All three spoke powerfully recalling the trauma they and their families have suffered and indeed continue to suffer.

It is crucial that the message of innocent victims & survivors of terrorism is heard against the backdrop of terrorism's revisionist strategy.



## Victims and Survivors Service (VSS) Update

As this Financial year draws to a close (on 31st March 2017) we want to remind those who are in receipt of VSS awards that they need to spend these up and return all paperwork by the end of the month. If you cannot spend the award on items listed within the eligibility list originally sent out with your Award letter then please contact the office and we can arrange for our Welfare Officer to complete a consultation form which will allow you to spend your award on items which are not listed within the VSS eligibility document.

For anyone who is bereaved, injured or a carer and who ARE NOT CURRENTLY registered with the VSS we ask that you get in touch with the office urgently in order to complete an Individual Needs Programme registration form. It is anticipated that these schemes may close to new applicants after 31st March 2017 so it is very important to act now and avoid missing out on future support from the VSS.

We have been given an opportunity through the Orange Order to run a day respite for young people on FRIDAY 21st APRIL 2017 (over the Easter holidays).


