Since our last Newsletter it's been all go at SEFF as we push on in putting together a Programme of events for the 2017/2018 financial year.

Please take time to go through this Newsletter marking out activities and services which you would wish to access - remember SEFF is your organisation and without your involvement, there is no legitimacy for our existence.

A significant time resource is currently being invested in the recruitment process for the appointment of 4 x Advocacy Support Workers to join a team led by Ken Funston (Advocacy Support Manager) and 2 x Health and Wellbeing Caseworkers. I am delighted as is the organisation that Ken has been able to be tuped across from the old Programme.

Ken will now have company and support for the difficult and complex work for which he is engaged. Because of this Peace IV opportunity SEFF will genuinely have Regional status as an organisation supporting innocent victims and survivors of terrorism from across Northern Ireland, republic of Ireland and Great Britain. We hope to have a team in place by end May 2017 and we would hope to have both teams operational from 1st July 2017 onwards.

I want to congratulate Matthew Gault who was recently appointed SEFF's Monitoring and I.T Development; we are also delighted to have Clive Johnston join our team as an I.T Development Consultant. We are confident that both men will contribute positively within these areas to SEFF's professional development as an organisation.

Please do pay your Membership Renewal at the earliest possible opportunity. Only those who have done so BY 31ST August 2017 will be communicated with or will be entitled to access services post that date. Anyone who has renewed at that point will be required to do so in advance of receiving a SEFF-funded activity or service.

Ister Scot Summer Schools



SEFF has recently applied to the Ulster Scots Agency for funding for the following Summer Schemes:

The annual **Ulster-Scots Summer School**, will be for sixty 7 to 16 year olds and will be held in Lisnaskea High School over five days, from **Monday 24th to Friday 28th July 2017**. The scheme will be jammed packed with activities over the five days, with a trip to the WWI Trench Experience in Cavan County Museum in Ballyjamesduff.

Subject to funding, we are also planning a **Youth Residential Weekend** at Rosscor Youth Village, near Belleek from Friday 11th to Sunday 13th August, for up to thirty 11 to 18 year olds.

If music and drama appeal, we are also organising two **Drama** Schools this August.

The first is a Jupier Drama from 31st July to 4^h August 2017, and is angled towards young people aged from 7 to 14 years. We anticipate that this will be held in Brookeborough Primary School. The second scheme will be a Sepier musical, from <u>Monday 21st-Friday 25th Au-</u> gust 2017 aimed at twenty 15 to 18 year olds. We are hoping that this will take place at Willowbridge School, Enniskillen.

Meet SEFF's new Advocacy Support Manager.....



I would like to introduce myself to anyone who doesn't already know me.

I am 56 years old and am originally from Tullyhommon, on the Fermanagh-Donegal border. I was brought up on a farm, being one of a family of eight siblings. I went to a local primary school, and later to Portora in Enniskillen. I joined the Royal Marines when I was 17, and during my service I was one of the first troops to land on the Falklands in 1982 in order to retake the islands from the Argentinian invaders. I joined the RUC in 1985, serving a total of almost 30 years, with a broad and varied career, and unfortunately was witness to many traumatic incidents.

I made a decision to improve my education some 15 years ago and since then I have successfully completed a certificate in teaching at Canterbury University, a Masters of Social Science in the Lifelong Learning Sector at Queens' University, and a further Masters at Queens' in Violence, Terrorism and Security. I am now working on a PhD at Ulster University.

My brother Ronnie was murdered in 1984 by the IRA, and for obvious reasons, I have retained a keen interest in victims and survivors issues. Following my retirement from the police, I worked for a number of short periods in the Middle East. In early 2015, I did some part-time work for the now defunct JIVT Ltd, I found it extremely rewarding helping innocent victims of terrorism. Later that year I was successful in being appointed the Advocacy Manager for SEFF. I am now delighted to announce that I have recently been appointed as the Advocacy Support Manager, with the responsibility of four staff, and the added pressure to support all those with advocacy needs to the fullest of our abilities.

I have been married for 28 years and have a grown-up son and daughter.
