- 21. Rosslea, Cordolagh Herbert (Herbie) Kernaghan 36, UDR Protestant, shot dead, by IRA during school deliveries October 15, 1979.
- 22. Rosslea Victor Buchanan RUC Protestant, survives injuries from bomb at Ballagh Cross derelict farm house June 11, 1972.
- 23. Rosslea Ernest Johnston 36, Protestant, RUC shot by the IRA on September 23 1980.
- 24. Rosslea, towards Magheraveely Drumady John McVitty 46,Protestant, RUC shot at his farm by the IRA on July 8, 1986.
- 25. Newtownbutler William Trotter 57, Protestant civilian Killed by IRA booby trap bomb in field on his farm, August 28 1972.
- 26. Magheraveely Lance Corporal William Creighton 27, Protestant, UDR, Shot by IRA outside his home August 7, 1972.
- 27. Newtownbutler, Richard (Richie) Latimer 39, UDR, Protestant, shot by IRA gunman at his hardware shop June 7, 1980.
- 28. Newtownbutler Crilly's Garage, the IRA shot dead Robert (Bob) Crilly RUC,Protestant on January 3, 1980.
- 29. Newtownbutler Derrydoon out farm, John Robert (Robin) Bell UDR, Protestant, was shot dead by the IRA on October 22, 1972.
- 30. Newtownbutler Victor Morrow 61,Protestant, ex-UDR, shot dead by IRA near his home, April 17,1980.
- 31. Tully South on Derrylin to Lisnaskea Road Ronald (Ronnie) Graham 39, Protestant UDR shot dead by IRA, June 5, 1981.
- 32. Teemore at Earl of Erne Primary School Lt Colonel George Saunderson 58, Protestant retired UDR was shot dead by the IRA, April 10, 1974.
- 33. Derrylin James (Jimmy) Graham UDR school bus driver, Protestant, was shot dead by the IRA on while off duty February 1, 1985.
- 34. Aghalane on the border near Derrylin Protestant husband and wife Thomas Bullock 53, UDR and Emily Bullock 50, shot dead by the IRA at their farm house September 21, 1972.

- 35. Lisnaskea area Errol Gordon 22, British Army, IRA land mine attack on patrol claimed his life August 7,1972.
- 36. Lisnaskea area David Wynne 21, British Army, Killed by IRA in land mine attack on mobile patrol August 7,1972.
- 37. Lisnaskea area Norman McKenzie 25, British Army Killed by IRA land mine attack on mobile patrol April 11,1974.

- 38. Lisnaskea to Newtownbutler Road, Mullanahorn town land, fishing-line bomb during the Troubles.
- 39. Newtownbutler Thomas McCann 19, British Army,found shot dead by IRA February 13, 1972.
- 40. Newtownbutler Gortinacarrow Martin Walsh 28, British Army, died in IRA shop booby trap bomb January 9, 1977.
- 41. Newtownbutler Legakelly Samuel Donegan 61, Garda Siochana strayed into Northern Ireland killed by IRA roadside bomb June 8, 1972.
- 42. Newtownbutler area Raymond McAdam 24, Catholic civilian Killed in IRA shop bomb Annaghmore, October 12 1973.
- 43. Newtownbutler Michael Kearney 21, Catholic an alleged informer, found shot dead by IRA July 12, 1979.
- 44. Newtownbutler Aughinahinch Naan's farm Michael Naan 35, Catholic civilian farmer and Andrew Murray 25, Catholic civilian, found stabbed to death October 24, 1972.
- 45. Newtownbutler The 'Dash' on main Lisnaskea to Newtownbutler Road. Bomb equipment discovered in two culverts circa 1970's/1980's.
- 46. Newtownbutler Culvert bomb triggered in culvert on 'The Dash' on Lisnaskea to Newtownbutler road.
- 47. Newtownbuter land mine and car chase, en route to Lisnaskea - courting couple during the Troubles.
- 48. Brookeborough IRA raid on RUC/B Special police station two IRA volunteers killed on January 1,1957.
- 49. Clogh the IRA shot all street lights, then held local family and intimidated them from the area in late 1970's.
- 50. Clogh, Caroline Moreland 34, Catholic from Belfast, an alleged informer was found shot by IRA, July 17, 1994.
- 51. Clogh hall bomb alert to lure security forces. Between 20lbs and 30lbs of explosives were detonated during the Troubles.
- 52. Rosslea road from Lisnaskea memorial cross and a telegraph pole to IRA terrorist Seamus McElwaine, shot by SAS April 26, 1986.
- 53. Rosslea woodland at Mullinahinch and former Rosslea Anthony Ahern 18, IRA terrorist from Cork, killed by his own bomb May 10, 1973.
- 54. Abduction by the IRA of Peter North who was forced to drive a pickup truck with a 3,500 pound bomb to Annaghtmartin military checkpoint. The parents were held at gunpoint. November, 1990.
- 55. Rosslea Road from Lisnaskea bomb attack on UDR patrol February 27, 1974.
- 56. Rosslea Derryvullan British Army soldiers Victor Husband and Brian Robertson killed in IRA land mine on June 2, 1972.
- 57. Rosslea Derryard IRA attack on vehicle check point British Army soldiers James Houston 23, and Michael Patterson aged 21 killed December 13, 1989.

SEFF BORDER TRAIL

South East Fermanagh Foundation (SEFF) is a group of victims/survivors formed in 1999 to support identified needs of innocent victims of paramilitary terrorism from the area. Today it helps people from Fermanagh, Tyrone and other areas.

This SEFF Border Trail of south eastern Fermanagh allows you to pay tribute to the memory and walk respectfully in the footsteps of some of those individuals, who perished at the hands of terrorists during the Northern Ireland Troubles.

Mapping incidents in this border location of South East Fermanagh helps to paint a graphically visual and educational interpretation of recent past events, embedding each memory of loss and trauma into the rural landscape.

COMMUNITY SUFFERING AT THE
HANDS OF A TERRORIST ONSLAUGHT

Over 3,529 individuals were killed and hundreds more were injured physically, psychologically or traumatised, and often left with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, as a result of terrorism.

Across County Fermanagh, 112 people were killed. In South East Fermanagh, 11 of these people were killed at Lisnaskea, 14 were killed at Rosslea, 13 in Newtownbutler, three in Maguiresbridge and one Brookeborough. These atrocities and the fear of further attacks forced an exodus of Protestant farmers from the border area.

Significantly in the majority of cases, no one was brought to justice. A handful of terrorists did serve time in prison, but were released back into the community under the Good Friday Agreement.

This Border Trail seeks to give visitors a sense of the deep hurts inflicted on communities and to demonstrate the humility of those affected and explain their resolve and heroism in surviving gross acts of injustice.

The geographical Trail area that you will travel has been dubbed "The Killing Fields" and you will understand why this is so.

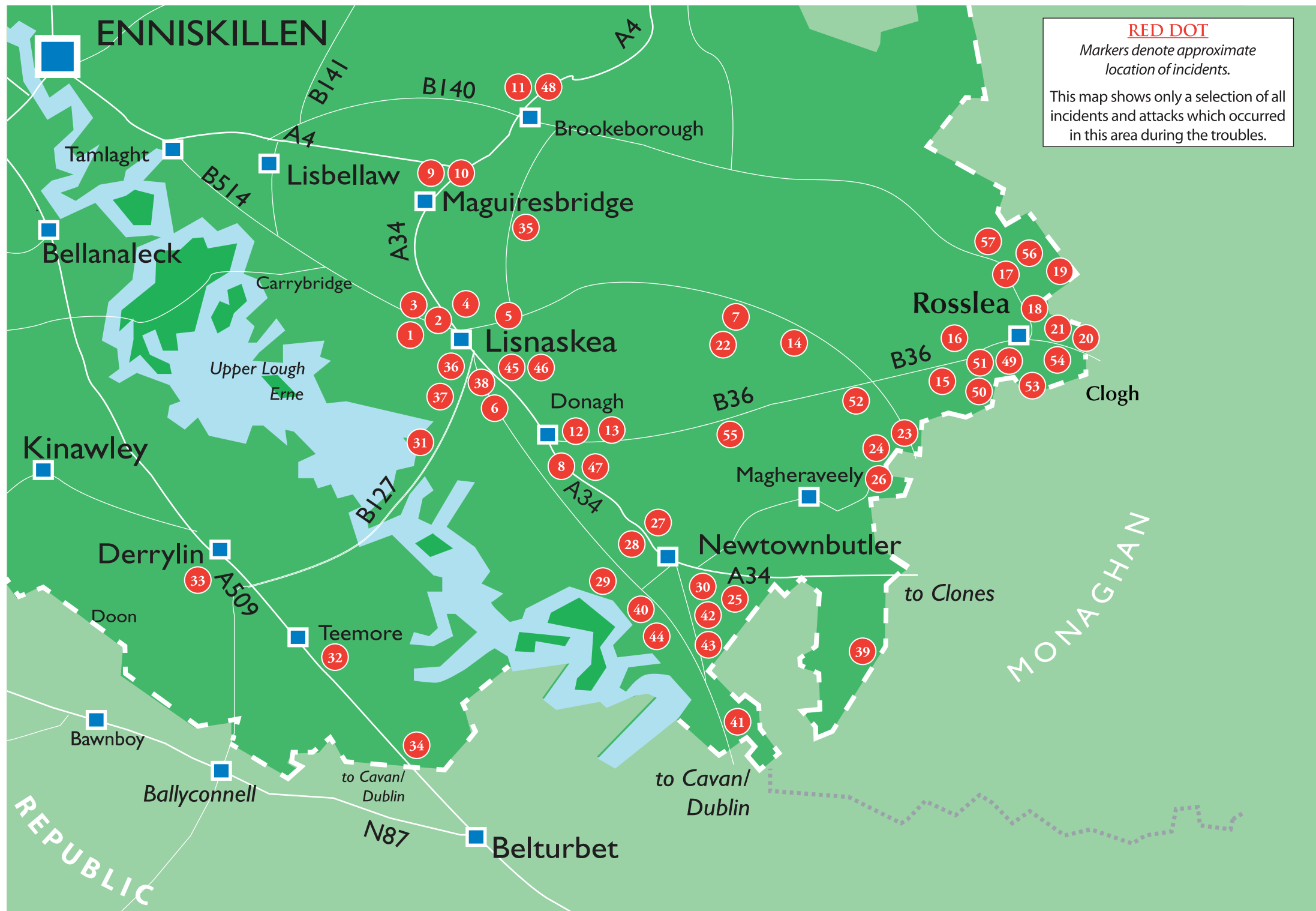

1. Lisnaskea, Maxol filling station, and Sylvan Hill. PSNI attacked by dissident republican improvised rocket August 16, 2008.
2. Lisnaskea IRA bombed Maxol filling station, a Protestant family-run business August 1988.
3. Lisnaskea school bus bomb attack on innocent pupils and driver Ernie Wilson Protestant, UDR/RUC June 28,1988.
4. Lisnaskea shop owner Roy Kells survived bomb at premises and being shot by IRA, while working on a window display February 5, 1981.
5. Lisnaskea near Holy Cross Church Norman Prue 29, Protestant RUC and Maughan, Robert 30, British Army undercover intelligence officers shot dead by IRA May 6, 1979.
6. Lisnaskea Crom Road Ian Wiggins RUC Protestant and wife Elsie survived an IRA attempt to shoot them on January 24, 1994.
7. Lisnaskea William Brown 18, Protestant, RUC shot dead by IRA sniper during patrol, March 13, 1977.
8. Lisnaskea to Newtownbutler road Drumgole Gordon Liddle 32, killed in land mine July 17, 1976.
9. Maguiresbridge Derek Breen 29, RUC Protestant shot dead by IRA at Talk of the Town bar and barman John McCabe 25, Catholic February 11, 1986.
10. Maguiresbridge Albert Beacom 43, Protestant, UDR member shot at his farm by the IRA November 17, 1981.
11. Brookeborough January 21, 1991 Cullen Stephenson 63, RUC, Protestant shot dead by IRA at Church Street January 21, 1991.
12. Donagh village, shots fired at Tommy Forster UDR Protestant circa 1974.
13. Donagh Cecil Graham 32, Protestant, UDR shot by the IRA on November 11 1981.
14. Rosslea Dernawilt IRA shot the late Johnny Kelly, Protestant, RUC. He survived the attack on the January 4, 1979.
15. Rosslea to Lisnaskea road Sylvia Crowe 31, Protestant civilian killed in roadside bomb on July 17, 1979.
16. Rosslea Dresternan townland, RUC Con Winston Howe 35, Protestant and RUC Con Joseph Rose 21, Protestant killed by IRA in 400lb land mine February 11, 1980.
17. Rosslea Douglas Deering 53, a Protestant shop proprietor, JP, shot by IRA, at his shop May 12, 1977.
18. Rosslea village incidents, Protestants Gordon Nixon and William Gordon USC killed March 21,1921
19. Rosslea Rellan Road farm house where Samuel Nixon USC was shot dead by IRA March 21, 1921.
20. Rosslea (on border) Nelson family members abducted by IRA for human bomb September 3, 1991.
