What is SEFF's Advocacy Service for?

SEFF's Advocacy Service aims to support innocent victims and survivors of terrorism and 'other Troubles related criminal violence' (in the Northern Ireland context) with an advocacy related issue, particularly but not exclusively related to their justice, truth and accountability needs.



Who are the 'Innocent?'

Innocent victims and survivors of the 'Troubles' are those who through no fault of their own have suffered - whether through being bereaved of a loved one, suffering from physical or psychological injury, providing care for such individuals or those who have been displaced from their home/land.

The Service Offers:

- Confidentiality and Empathy
- Support to engage with the Independent Commission for Reconciliation and Information Retrieval (ICRIR) or any other structure introduced to replace it
- Engage with the PSNI's Legacy Investigation Branch where still appropriate
- Support to engage with Police Ombudsman for Northern Ireland and Garda Siìochaina Commission
- Support to engage with the Coroner's Office
- Support to engage with the Omagh Inquiry and any other Public Inquiries established for troubles related Legacy
- Support in having your experiences of Terrorism/ 'The Troubles' recorded
- Promotion of victim and survivor issues within the public and media domains
- Networking groups and individuals who are innocent victims and survivors of terrorism and 'other Troubles related violence'
- Media skills guidance and advice to empower victims/survivors to speak out for themselves
- Sign-posting to other services within SEFF i.e. Counselling, Complementary Therapies, Welfare Advice and Appeals, TPDPS (Victims pension) and onward referral beyond SEFF, and providing research to these services
- Legacy trails education project (covering Fermanagh, Castlederg and South Armagh) and associated virtual App
